

## **Tri-County Camps 2021: SOUL ON FIRE**



After missing out on camp last year due to Covid-19, it was GREAT to get back to Baptist Hill in June for Tri-County's Summer Camp "SOUL ON FIRE." 138 children and youth learned to "Never let the fire in your heart go out. Keep it alive. Serve the Lord" (Romans 12:11) in our two camps that run at the same time—Sparks Kids (grades 3 through 6) led by Cindy Kinser (FBC Ozark) and Ignite Youth (grades 7 though 9) led by Bryan Ridenour (North Nixa). The 52 adult leader-volunteers who came are our camp's real heroes for investing in the spiritual lives of our churches' next generation.

It was four fun-filled, activity-packed days of worship, Bible study and learning about missions, games, crafts, recreation, swimming, and archery (with a little crawdad hunting thrown in!) **Real Encounter Ministries** amazed us with their extreme sports demonstration that ended with a very clear yet simple Gospel presentation. God's presence came upon Baptist Hill and **several made public professions of faith** during the week. Thanks to God—and thank you Tri-County churches!

# Beyond Local—en español!

Tri-County is creating new pathways that allow our churches extend their Great Commission impact beyond our local communities. This summer we assisted church planters **Angel and Rachel Morales as they plant Camino a la Cruz (Way to the Cross) Church** among the more than 200,000 Hispanics that live in Omaha, Nebraska.

Tri-County churches **collected supplies and donated funds** so that Camino could have a back-to-school backpack outreach, and folks from Selmore Baptist took the collected supplies up to Omaha. Pastor Angel reports, "The Back to School Bash was a huge success. Camino handed out 75 backpacks and supplies to the kids who came. Thank you for your donations of supplies and backpacks! The kids and adults had a great time."
