COLLEGIATE MINISTRY UPDATE: In

April, Tri-County's long-time campus missionary at College of the Ozarks, Dr. Kyle Rapinchuk, submitted his resignation as BSU Director. We are thankful for Kyle and Kristin's almost 11 years of service and wish them all the best! Since then, Tri-County's collegiate ministry team has been meeting to determine next steps for our collegiate ministry and to begin a search for our next campus missionary. Here's a brief outline of our thinking:

- CofO is a unique mission field in our area and we cannot leave that field "untended."
- We've been in contact with MBC's Collegiate Ministry and intend to continue our partnership with them.
- To align ourselves with what other campus ministries are doing across the state, our campus ministry "re-boot" won't be called "BSU," but "BCM" (Baptist Collegiate Ministry).
- The new director will be a part-time employee of Tri-County, and we are developing a job description for the BCM Director, which will be approved by Tri-County's Administrative Team. We will search for this person locally. The job description will be posted on Tri-County's website.
- Our primary goals for the coming academic year include having weekly worship experiences and developing a student leadership base.
- Please be in prayer that the Lord will raise up His person to lead this very important ministry.

And please be in prayer for Tri-County's BCM ministry team, for wisdom and discernment: Mark Miller (Executive Pastor, FBC Branson); Dr. Juston Gates (Lead Pastor, FBC Forsyth);

Dr. Justin Carswell (Vice-President for Christian Ministries at CofO); and Dr. Rusty Osborne (Associate Professor of Biblical and Theological Studies at CofO).

SERVE GOD! Working together, we are preparing the current and next generation for ministry, and we're doing it two ways: the **Jim and** Judy Wells Ministry Scholarship and the Tri-**County Bible Institute.**

WELLS SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS: In 2018, Tri-County established the Jim and Judy Wells Ministry Scholarship to honor our former DOM and his wife Jim and Judy Wells and to assist members of Tri-County churches who are called into vocational ministry with their ministry training expenses. Since it was established, the Wells Scholarship has disbursed \$13,618.75 and helped individuals from Tri-County churches with their ministry education.
